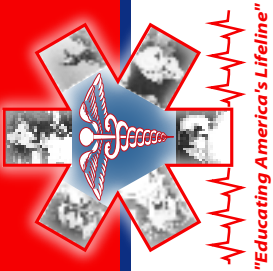

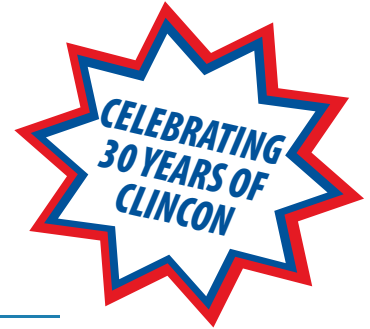

Program Objectives

10. Compare and contrast the research on angioplasty verses thrombolytics for MI patients.

Explain the indications, contraindications, routes of administration side effects, doseages and special considerations for the following medications: Potassium, Heparin, Blood, Dobutamine, Trebutaline, Fibrolytics, Protamine, Blood products, Nitroprusside Norepinephrine, Procainamide Mannitol, Aminophyllin and Insulin
12. Compare and contrast the various transport infusion devices.
13. Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of the various transport infusion devices.
14. Describe the troubleshooting method for each transport infusion device.
15. Explain the sign and symptoms, treatment modalities and critical thinking skills needed in the assessment of the multi-trauma patient.
16. Discuss the similarities and differences in the pathophysiology of asthma and COPD.
17. Explain the therapeutic tools available for the prehospital provider to care for the asthma and COPD patient.
18. Explain the indications and contraindications for the prehospital use of Levalbuterol, Magnesium Sulfate, Heliox in Asthma and COPD patients.
19. Explain the indications and contradictions for non-invasive ventilatory techniques for the treatment of asthma and COPD.
20. Discuss the controversies affecting the provision of prehospital care today.
21. Discuss the model prehospital treatment protocols for crush syndrome.
22. Compare and contrast the pathophysiology and differences between crush syndrome and compartment syndrome.
23. Discuss the most common causes of structural collapse and what EMS personnel should be aware of when responding to a structure collapse call.
24. Explain the kinematics and types of injuries most likely associated with structural collapse.
25. Explain the legal issues related to patient refusal of treatment and transport.
26. Explain how a reluctant patient can be motivated to accept treatment and transport.
27. Explain how the need for security in a correctional facility can effect your response to a medical emergency.
28. Describe the unique impact working in prison cells can have on infection control procedures.
29. Explain the general rules for EMS response to a patient who is a dignitary.
30. Explain the importance of integrating the EMS response with that of a dignitary security force.
31. Discuss the legal rights and obligations of an EMS provider in ER diversion/EMTALA situation.
32. Discuss the relationship between documentation and EMS provider liability.
33. Discuss the lessons learned for the top 5 EMS workplace lawsuits.
34. Discuss & demonstrate strategies for preparing a paper for publication.
35. Prepare a paper, revise a paper and submit it for publication by a publishing company or magazine.
36. Describe the importance of research in modern EMS.
37. Describe the scientific method and its application to EMS research.
38. Detail the common styles of EMS research & recognize the inherent strengths and weaknesses of each.
