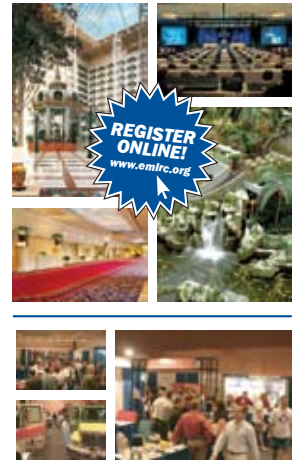

- Discuss and be able to define the roles of selected care providers as they relate to organ donations.
- Discuss the initial management and interventions needed for the potential organ donor and how they might differ from that of a patient with a non-lethal injury.

Continuing Education Credit

Each Physician should claim only those hours of credit that he/she actually spends in the educational activity. Application has been made to the American College of Emergency Physicians for ACEP Category 1 credit and the American Osteopathic Association for Category 2 Credit.

Nurses - Up to 23.75 nursing contact hours will be provided by the Florida Emergency Medicine Foundation (FEMF). The FEMF is approved as a provider of nursing education by the Florida Board of Nursing, Provider # 2731.
