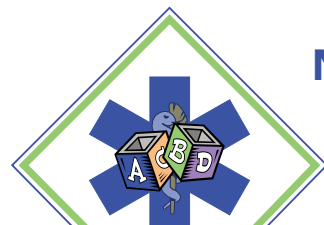

- ~ Describe the controversy surrounding AED use in children.
- ~ Discuss the initial management and interventions for the pediatric patient with neurological issues.
- ~ Explain/discuss signs and symptoms of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS).
- ~ Explain/discuss the environmental characteristics of the probable SIDS event.
- ~ Explain/discuss the clinical characteristics of the probable SIDS infant.
- ~ Explain/discuss the process/procedure for assessment of a probable SIDS scene.
- ~ Explain/discuss the procedure/process for providing support to parents of a SIDS infant.
- ~ Explain/discuss the benefits of using a color coding system to determine pediatric medication doses.
- ~ Explain/discuss the benefits of using a color coding system to determine the proper signing for pediatric airway adjuncts.
- ~ Explain the benefits of using a color coding system or a weight based system in the pediatric patient.
- ~ Explain/discuss the anatomy issues related to vascular access in the pediatric patient.
- ~ Explain/discuss the various vascular access adjuncts that are available for obtaining pediatric vascular access.
