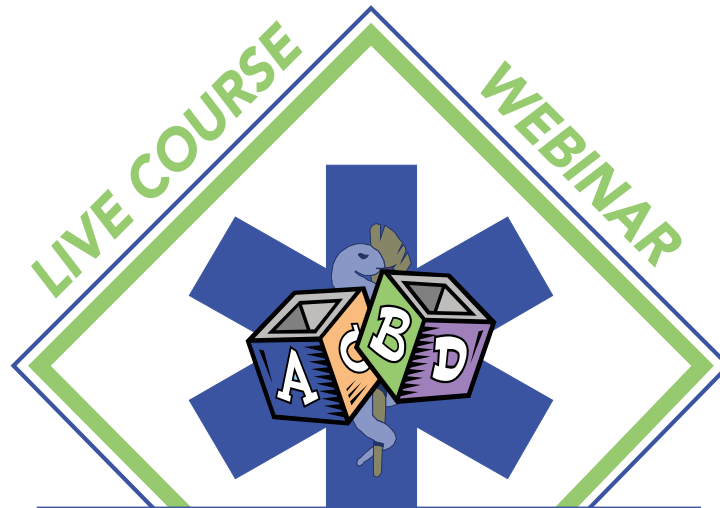


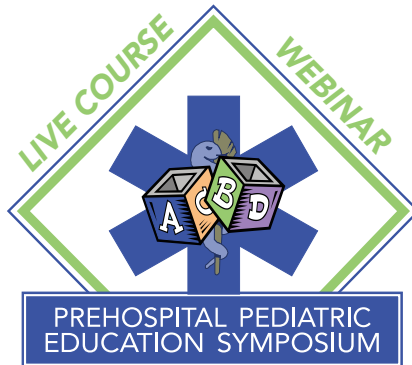

Prehospital Pediatric Education Symposium is designed to create an educational experience that will empower EMS and ED personnel to provide the highest quality emergency care to their pediatric patients.

Program Objectives
