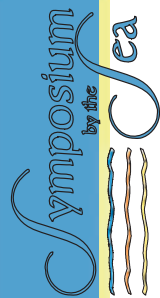

Overview

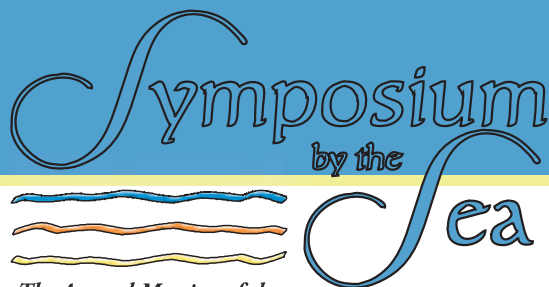

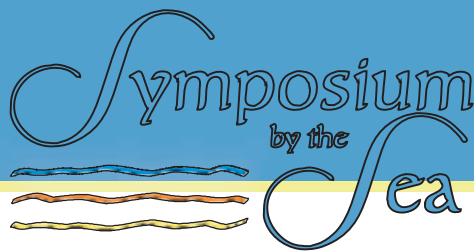

Program Objectives

- ~ Discuss initial management of blast trauma.
- ~ Briefly review the pathophysiology related to acute respiratory failure.
- ~ Review the relationship between mode of mechanical ventilation and work of breathing.
- ~ Introduce the concept of monitoring airway pressures to identify patients at risk for ventilator induced lung injury.
- ~ Describe the approaches to adjustment of ventilator settings to reduce risk of ventilator associated lung injury in specific disease states.
- ~ Discuss the current literature with regard to critical care medicine.
- ~ Discuss the signs & symptoms for the endocrine emergencies.
- ~ Discuss the management and treatment process for endocrine emergencies.
- ~ Discuss the most current information (clinical and administrative) on HIV/AIDS.
- ~ Discuss the most current information (clinical and administrative) on Domestic Violence.
- ~ Discuss the most current information (clinical and administrative) on preventing medical errors.
