



Safe Opioid Prescribing for Acute Pain

This will be followed by a discussion on the alternative and adjuncts to opioids for pain management, including evidence-based addiction treatment options and optimal standard of care treatments for pain. This course will review recent legislative actions and how they affect you, the practitioner.
