**Webinar Overview and Objectives:**

In the early morning of June 12, 2016, a man armed with an assault-style rifle and a pistol attacked the Pulse Nightclub in Orlando, Florida. In the hours that followed, hundreds of first responders, physicians, nurses, and healthcare administrators were thrust into an unimaginable situation. The active shooter scenario turned into a hostage crisis, which was then followed by a law enforcement siege resulting in one of the worst mass shootings in modern United States history. This presentation will discuss the medical response from the initial moments of the attack to the days that followed. Comparing our experience to available evidence will improve understanding of the approach to an active shooter and a mass fatality event, as well as the difficult process of coordinating efforts that do not just end when the shooting does.

- Describe the EMS approach to active shooting – swift assist victim extrication, patient tracking, etc.
- Review and describe law enforcement’s transport of penetrating trauma - Is it safe? Do tourniquets help?
- Describe mass fatality processes – the part of MCI drills no one wants to talk about.

- Review and describe family reunification recognizing that the MCI does not end when the patients have all been transported.
